a word from our president

We had a great rally in Bend, OR and big thanks to our hosts and co-hosts Michael & Kim Schanze & Fonny & Mim Davidson. Traveling to Bend and on the way coming back we encountered a lot of rain. Fortunately, the days in Bend were a little cool but not raining during the day which made the outings enjoyable.

Now here is my story of being lucky. Before we left to Bend, I did some repairs on our 2007 Airstream. Just before leaving home, Marilyn and I smelled gas. Well, I did a brief check to see where the smell came from and found nothing. Before we left home, I got one of the propane tanks certified and filled. I was running the fridge on propane as we packed. It quit working and I thought it was a little odd but I just turned on the other tank that was ½ full or more and the fridge started right up again. I was busy with other repairs getting the trailer ready and put the odor problem in the back of my mind.

We hit the road to Bend on Thursday. After arrival and setup, we didn't smell gas and went about settling in. Later that evening, I turned on the furnace as usual. Friday morning, I woke up early to take the dog out and had an awful headache. I thought that it was just from allergies which I get when the grass is in bloom. Marilyn sent out a message to the group that I wasn't feeling well when I decided not to go to the fish hatchery. We went to a store for allergy medicine and did once again smell gas back at the trailer. That afternoon I felt better and went to see the alpacas and left the bathroom vent open. We had the door open on the trailer the rest of that afternoon. Saturday evening, when it was time for some heat, I discovered that all of the propane was gone. Now I had a mystery that definitely involved a leak! We used our trusty space heater that night and our heat pump on Sunday when the weather became much colder. (And thanks to all of you who asked if I was feeling better)

During our trip home with the Collinses, I told my story to Jerry about propane. Usually I can go all summer with just one tank. Jerry said that he would bring over his gas detector ("sniffer") and we'd check it out after I got my propane tanks filled. When he arrived, I turned on my tanks and I opened the trailer, the gas detector warning sound went off as soon as Jerry stepped inside the doorway. I had a leak in the stovetop regulator. After we found where the leak was coming from, we were talking about what could have happened. He asked me if I got a headache and I said yes. He then asked if Marilyn had a headache and I said that I didn't think so because she never said anything. I admit I was up and down a number of times during the night and she was not. I now realized my headache was from propane, not allergies! Talk about being



Why did you join/who asked you to join the club? We were gifted a one year membership when we purchased our Airstream.


What have been your favorite trips/rallies as a part of the club? We just attended our first rally in Bend, Oregon and had a wonderful time.

Seeking Shelter From the Storm

Lightning Safety Awareness Week is June 23-29, and the National Weather Service (NWS) wants everyone to remember: When Thunder Roars, Go Indoors! There has been one lightning fatality in the U.S. this year. In 2018, there were 20 fatalities, all of which occurred either outdoors or in an unsafe shelter. Seeking a safe shelter can make a difference in protecting yourself.

What are safe shelters?

NWS defines a safe building as one that is fully enclosed with a roof, walls and floor, and has plumbing or wiring. Examples of safe buildings include a home, school, church, hotel, office building or shopping center. Vehicles can also be used as shelter, but only certain types of vehicles are safe. A safe vehicle is any fully enclose metal topped vehicle such as a hard topped car, minivan, bus, truck or full cab heavy equipment.





What shelters are considered unsafe?

Unsafe buildings include car ports, open garages, covered patios, picnic shelters, beach pavilions, golf shelters, tents of any kind, baseball dugouts, sheds and greenhouses. Unsafe vehicles include convertibles, golf carts, riding mowers, open cab farm or construction equipment and boats without cabins.

What makes a shelter safe?

The most important element for a structure is that it is fully enclosed and has wiring and/or plumbing. This reduces the risk of contact with the lightning. When lightning directly strikes this type of building, the electrical current from the flash will usually travel through the wiring and/or plumbing and then into the ground. Structures that are not enclosed or lack these features may not provide protection. The same principle applies to vehicles. The metal roof and sides provide the protection from the lightning. The rubber tires do not. Rubber tires can act more like a conductor than insulating. A person is safe in an enclosed vehicle because the lightning travels around the surface of the vehicle and then goes to ground.

Maximize Safety Inside a Shelter

- $\Rightarrow~$ Stay OFF corded phones. Use only cellular or cordless phones
- \Rightarrow Do not touch electrical equipment or cords. Unplug electronic equipment before the storm arrives
- \Rightarrow Avoid plumbing. Do not wash your hands, take a bath, shower or wash dishes
- ⇒ Stay away from windows and doors, stay off porches. Do not lie on concrete floors and do not lean against concrete walls


